FOOD PLOTS AND POLLINATOR PASTURES

Planting a food plot or pollinator pasture for wildlife takes thought and planning. Learn about food plots and pastures, their benefits, and how to install a food plot or pollinator pasture to benefit animals such as deer, turkey, bear, moose, rabbits, song birds, grouse or woodchucks or pollinators such as bees, honey bees, hoverflies or hummingbirds.

FALL BULB PLANTING AND PREPARATION

Fall-planted bulbs produce the first blooms of next year's season. The bulbs spend the winter making roots and come up early in the spring. So, if you think that autumn's the time to stop gardening, think again! We will learn about bulb-planting, preparation of the planting site, soil conditions and moisture supply, protection from rodents, ideas for over planting when bloom has finished and more.

KEYNOTE WORKSHOP: METHODS AND SAFETY IN PRESERVING MEAT, POULTRY AND FISH

If you have a family history of farming or hunting, you may have tasted or heard of canned beef, chicken, pork, or venison. Farm families and hunters processed animals and game in the fall and canned the meat for winter meals.

With the renewed interest in food preservation, there has been resurgence in the home canning of meat and game. We will learn safe methods of preserving meat, game, poultry and fish by canning, freezing, or drying to produce tasty quality products.
