(Alcohol Server Knowledge – Interactive Training)

The purpose of this 3 hour course is to instruct attendees on the procedures used to sell alcoholic beverages legally in their establishments. Although the State Of Minnesota does not require server certification, many counties and cities require basic server training for all employees responsible for serving alcoholic beverages in their establishments. There is no prerequisite for this class.

Topics covered in this workshop include:

- * MN laws and penalties for violations
- * Dram Shop laws
- * Legal forms of ID – proof of age
- * How to verify IDs and spot fake IDs
- * BAC (blood alcohol content) and effects of alcohol on the body
- * Signs of intoxication
- * How to slow down service
- * How to stop service
- * How to avoid confrontation

Owners, operators, managers and employees of "on sale" facilities that sell alcoholic beverages to the public, including:

- * Bars
- * Restaurants
- * VFW and American Legion
- * Casinos*
- Sports facilities and alcoholic beverage vendors
- * Golf courses and drink-cart personnel
- * Cafes & delis that serve alcohol
- * Any other establishment that prepares and serves alcoholic beverages on site
